COVID-19 UPDATES



SENIOR PROGRAMMING 2020

Aging with Pride (in collaboration with Edmonton Pride Seniors Group): telephone-based supportive phone service for Seniors/Elders (50+). 4:00 - 5:00 pm every Wednesday.

Information and Referral (Seniors supports): We will be providing telephone-based information and referral services for 2SLGBTQ+ Seniors. In order to access these services, Seniors must set up an appointment via the Seniors Outreach Coordinators' phone line at (587) 635-2169.

One-On-One Support: Are you trans, gay or under the pride umbrella and want to connect with more people like yourself, but lack the ability to do so? There are people from your community that want to help! We offer mentorship and caregiving that meets you at wherever you are. This is a multigenerational program connecting youth with older adults. LGBTQ2S+ SENIORS AND ELDERS OF ALL BACKGROUNDS HAVE ACCESS TO ALL THE SUPPORT AND RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO THEM, WITH CARE, AND FEEL FREE TO GROW IN THEIR EMPOWERMENT, BE AND SHOW THEMSELVES AS MUCH OR AS LITTLE AS THEY WANT, SAFELY, IN SENIOR SPACES IN EDMONTON.


